*The Egyptian Museum was first built in Boulak. In 1891, it was moved to Giza Palace of "Ismail Pasha" which housed the antiquities that were later moved to the present building. The Egyptian Museum is situated at Tahrir square in Cairo. It was built during the reign of Khedive Abbass Helmi II in 1897, and opened on November 15, 1902. It has 107 halls. At the ground floor there are the huge statues. The upper floor houses small statues, jewels, Tut Ankh Amon treasures and the mummies. The Egyptian museum comprises many sections arranged in chronological order. It also includes a photography section and a large library. A special hall for the royal mummies was opened at the museum, housing eleven Kings and Queens.*



**-Visit to the Pyramids of Guizah \$32.00 and the Sphinx (visit duration about 1 ½ hr)**



## **Pyramids**

*Cheops, Chefren and Mykerinos. The ancient Egyptian aim in building the Pyramids was that they should preserve & protect the bodies of the Pharaoh for they believed in resurrection and immortality. The Sphinx: A Mythical statue with the face of a man and the body of a Lion. The Sphinx and the 3 Pyramids were considered one of the Seven Wonders of the World in ancient times*

**-Sound & Light show at the Pyramids\$ \$28.00**

*It is one of the most important of Cairo nights' entertainment, an artistic presentation that relies on sound and Light producing inspiring atmosphere which takes one back to events of ancient History the story of the building of the Pyramids and the Glory of the Pharaohs*
